

## PRESS RELEASE UITP EUROPE RESPONDS TO THE SMART AND SUSTAINABLE MOBILITY STRATEGY



BRUSSELS, 10 DECEMBER 2020

Led by President of the UITP's EU Committee, **UITP Europe** is responding to the publication of the <u>Smart and Sustainable Mobility Strategy</u>.

Ulrich Weber welcomes that the Strategy recognises more than ever **the importance** of daily local mobility, but considers that in **the middle of the current ecological and** economic crisis the European Commission must become more ambitious for urban and daily mobility and must clearly encourage a modal shift to public transport.

Public transport offers sustainable mobility to all citizens.

It helps to **reduce congestion**, as well as air pollutant emissions and road accidents in cities and is **affordable and inclusive**.

With its large passenger capacities, public transport is the backbone of sustainable and safe mobility in any European city.

Furthermore, **investments into public transport have a multiplier effect** in the local economy exceeding **five times the initial investment**.

"As President of the UITP EU Committee I expect that the positive role of public transport – acknowledged in numerous strategic papers by Member States, regional and local governments across Europe – is also supported at the European level. The ambitious objectives of the Green Deal cannot be attained without making public transport a priority and encouraging modal shift. I therefore call for a set of coherent European initiatives to be announced to create a policy framework that clearly supports modal shift towards public transport."
